EDGEWORTH BOROUGH PLANNING COMMISSION REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING May 13, 2015

MEETING was called to order at 7:30 p.m. with Chairman Mario Peluso presiding and the following members of the Commission and officials of the Borough present: Mr. David Aloe, Mr. Mario Peluso, Mr. Dave Martin and Mr. Martin McDaniel, Borough Manager and Secretary.

NEW BUSINESS:

SKETCH PLAN – PROPOSED SELLECK SUBDIVISION ALONG WAY HOLLOW ROAD.

Mr. David Selleck addressed the members of the Planning Commission with a proposal to subdivide his existing lot located at 12 Woodland Road into three lots; one where the current residence is, and two new lots which would be accessed from Way Hollow Road. Mr. Selleck is in the preliminary stages of planning this subdivision, and presented the Borough with a sketch plan with his intensions. Mr. McDaniel, Borough Manager and Zoning Officer, has reviewed the sketch plan and sent it to the Borough Engineer for comment. In turn, the Borough Geotechnical Engineer submitted a review letter which the Planning Commission and property owner have been provided for review. The proposed subdivision lies in the Conservation Overlay Zoning District (CO District) where more stringent building and geotechnical requirements exist. The current sketch plan shows approximate locations of the residences. Mr. Aloe and Mr. Peluso discussed problems with construction in steep slope areas and slides that have occurred in that area in the past. Since it is unlawful to create lots that are not buildable, and since exact footprints and locations of proposed structures are required in the CO District, as well as access drive and sewer construction special exceptions, the Planning Commission recommends that a geotechnical report be completed, as well as a more specific set of plans be drafted indicating where the proposed residences would be located on the new lots.

There being no further business, the meeting on motion duly made and seconded was adjourned at 7:55 p.m.
