As summer weather fades and fall moves in, here are a few reminders for the upcoming season! Remember to check the Edgeworth Borough Facebook page and website to keep up with events and announcements. Feel free to call the Borough office with any questions!



FALL LEAF COLLECTION

Fall leaf collection will begin the week of September 29th, weather permitting. Please have leaves ready for collection by December 5th, and advise your landscaping contractors of this deadline. No brush, shrubbery clippings, or grass may be mixed in with leaves! These materials will clog the leaf truck and stop the collection process altogether. Regular weekly brush collection continues every Friday during leaf season and throughout the year. If you have leaves and brush out at the same time, please make sure they are in two separate and distinct piles. Please place leaves along the street line or in the area next to the curb. Do NOT place leaves on the pavement. Placing leaves on the street can cause sewer back-ups, clogged catch basins, and entice children to play in the leaves on the street, creating a potentially dangerous situation. Do not put any foreign objects in leaf piles as these will damage the equipment and can cause serious injury.

WAY HOLLOW ROAD REOPENING

PennDOT construction on Way Hollow Road is nearing completion. The road is expected to reopen and be turned over to the Borough by the end of October. While construction is still ongoing, it is very important for residents to avoid the area. There is NO pedestrian or bicycle traffic allowed on Way Hollow Road while PennDOT is working. Because it is an active work zone, there is heavy equipment operating and this creates a potentially dangerous situation for pedestrians. Please continue to avoid the area!

When the road does reopen, it will still be important to exercise safe and responsible driving in the area. As on all Borough streets, please be aware of your speed and any children, dogs, or other pedestrians that might be in the area. Way Hollow Road is an important connection to Sewickley Heights and has several significant curves, so it will also be important to drive free of distractions, such as cell phone use and eating. Let's work together to keep our residents safe!



PUBLIC WORKS SPOTLIGHT

You will begin to see our Public Works crew out and about collecting leaves, so we wanted to spotlight them and all the hard work they do! Our Public Works Department is made up of four full-time employees. Laborers Jim Wigton, Pete Kovacs, and Matt McMurray are led by supervisor Jim Vичeck. The department is responsible for the management and supervision of all activities relating to Borough streets and property maintenance, storm sewers, parks and recreational facilities, as well as the municipal building and grounds. If you ever see them out in the Borough, feel free to stop and say hi!

HARD TO RECYCLE EVENT

The Quaker Valley Council of Governments, in partnership with the Pennsylvania Resources Council, is bringing a Hard to Recycle event to our region on Saturday, October 18th from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm at Northgate Area High School. Hard to Recycle events provide a responsible and convenient option for disposal of items that are not eligible for curbside recycling. Popular hard to recycle items include e-waste, cell phones, freon-containing appliances, tires, televisions, polystyrene packaging, and more.

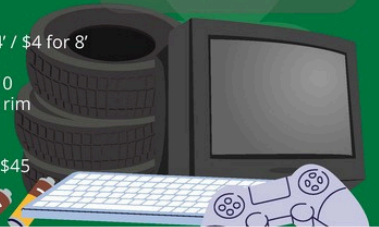

END OF DAY PICKUP REMINDERS

KEEP OUR KIDS HEALTHY

According to the National Youth Risk Behavior Survey, high school students' rates of physical activity and their daily consumption of fruits and vegetables are decreasing. Healthy eating and appropriate physical activity in childhood and adolescence are important for proper growth and development, as well as the prevention of chronic health conditions.

PROPER POOL DRAINING

As we leave the summer heat behind and welcome in autumn's cooler temperatures, many residents will begin to prepare their swimming pools and spas for the winter season. It is crucial that you follow proper draining techniques and maintenance procedures to ensure that no harmful chemicals found in pool water make their way into our streams and rivers, which could have negative impacts on our aquatic ecosystem. Remember - only rain goes down the drain! Read through the following tips to help keep our waterways healthy and thriving.



Reduce chlorine levels to undetectable levels before draining any pool water. These levels can be reduced by adding a dechlorinating chemical, or stopping chlorine treatments and leaving your pool uncovered for 10-14 days.

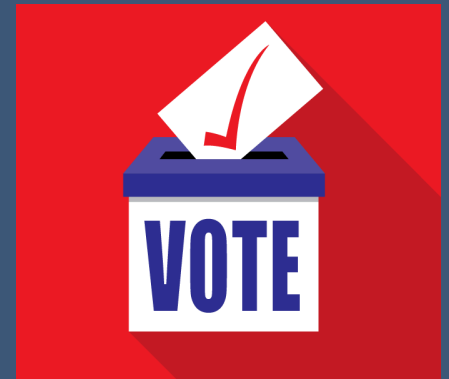


If you are draining only a portion of your pool to reduce the water level, discharge water into your lawn if possible. This helps to naturally filter out harmful chemicals that may otherwise end up in the Ohio River.



Pool water cannot be discharged into the road or into a catch basin if it contains any chemicals. Excess pool chemicals and water treatments are not allowed to be dumped into the road or down catch basins as these sewers flow directly into waterways and are not treated.

2025 GENERAL ELECTION



The 2025 General Election for federal and state offices will be held on Tuesday, November 4th, 2025. All Edgeworth residents cast their ballots at Edgeworth Elementary School, located at 200 Meadow Lane, between 7:00 am and 8:00 pm. You must be in line by 8:00 pm in order to be able to vote!

Residents interested in mail-in voting must fill out an application and return it to the Allegheny County Elections Office by 5:00 pm on Tuesday, October 28th, 2025. The Elections Office can be reached at 412-350-4500 or by visiting votespa.com if you have any questions regarding mail-in voting, voter registration, or other voter concerns.

If you are not currently registered to vote and would like to do so, you must complete your registration before Monday, October 20th in order to be able to vote in the 2025 General Election.
