
2022 General Election

The 2022 General Midterm Election will be held on Tuesday, November 8th, 2022. All Edgeworth residents may cast their ballots at Edgeworth Elementary School, located at 200 Meadow Lane, between 7:00 am and 8:00 pm.



Residents may also apply for a mail-in ballot. Mail-in ballot applications must be received by Allegheny County by Tuesday, November 1st. Fall Leaf Collection

The Fall Leaf Collection Program will begin in mid-October, weather permitting. Please have leaves ready for collection by December 9th, and advise your landscape contractor of this deadline. Leaf pickup after this date will be as needed and weather dependent until the Spring Leaf Collection Program begins.

- **No brush, shrubbery clippings or grass may be mixed in with the leaves.** These materials will clog the leaf collection machine and stop the collection process altogether. Regular weekly brush collection continues during leaf season.
- Please place leaves along the street line or in the area next to the curb, NOT on the pavement. Placing leaves on the street can cause sewer back-ups, clogged catch basins, and entice children to play in the leaves in the street. This creates a dangerous situation.

- Do not put any foreign objects in the leaf pile as this will damage the equipment, and can cause a serious injury.
- It may take up to one week for the leaf truck to reach all streets in the Borough. If your leaves are not collected within one week, please notify the Borough office.



Political Signs: Where Can They Go?

Displaying political signs is a popular way to support desired candidates during election cycles. However, sign location and size must comply with all Borough ordinances. No signs may be posted on public property, including telephone poles or street signs, or in any public right of way, which is typically the area between the sidewalk and the street. Political signs posted on private property may be no larger than sixteen square feet in size, and no more than eight total signs may be posted on a single lot. Any violation of these rules will result in the sign's removal. Please keep these rules in mind throughout election season!
